授業の目標 (Course Objectives)

At the end of this course, students should be able to:

- apply relevant sociological theories about gendered experiences and phenomena to gender-related social issues,
- describe gender ideology and practices in multiple social institutions and across cultures and societies, and analyze how social structure shapes gendered identities and experiences with ethnographic analysis.

授業の内容 (Course Contents)

This course helps students understand gender as a social construction. The traits considered to be masculine or feminine have some basis in biology but are molded by sociocultural forces. We will first review sociological theories of gender and sexuality and examine how gender varies by sexual orientation. Then, we will investigate gender in context to understand how gender relations, norms, and practices are thought, built, and shaped through social, political, economic institutions and interaction across cultures and societies with a particular reference to the case of Japan, including family, media, politics, and workplace. Students will have the opportunity to examine gender-related issues of their interest in their final paper.
