Students who successfully complete this course will be able to (1) understand how to think and inquire anthropologically and what the merit of it is, (2) understand the relevance of cultural anthropology for articulating the complexities of modern life, and (3) develop cross-cultural perspectives on how humans relate to one other and to material world.

授業の内容(Course Contents)

IMPORTANT NOTICE: This course will be taught fully online. Students must attend online live classes via Zoom while a few classes will be delivered in recorded video form through the semester. In the latter case, students watch the video lecture and prepare for the group discussion and oral quizzes in the next class. (See "Others" below for course participation requirement.)

Cultural Anthropology is the study of human cultures. Through the eyes of "the others," you will learn to suspend your assumptions about how the world works and about what is "normal" and what is "strange." This course is designed to provide you with an overview of the discipline of Cultural Anthropology, as well as an awareness of the importance and merit of anthropological knowledge in contemporary society. You will acquire through this course anthropological way of seeing and thinking by learning the history of anthropological thoughts and by focusing on the important issues in each anthropological sub-discipline and topic. By the end of the semester, you will have a sense of the anthropological perspective and the ability to apply it to various social issues.
